High standards and high expectations



How can I support my child's learning?


- 1. Ensure your child is equipped for school each day

Useful extras: highlighter pen, glue stick, calculator





2. Attendance

The preparation time for these assessments are crucial.


Attendance is an absolute priority.

3. Support your child with homework



- 1. Check the homework dashboard regularly
- •Log into Satchel One to view all assigned homework tasks
- •Use filters to check due dates, subjects, and completion status
- •Encourage your child to review it with you daily or weekly to stay organised
- 2. Help create a homework routine
- •Use the information from Satchel One to plan a consistent homework routine
- •Break tasks into manageable chunks and set reminders for deadlines
- Praise effort and progress to build motivation and independence
- 3. Communicate with teachers if needed
- •If a task is unclear or your child is struggling, use Satchel One to message the teacher
- •Stay informed about feedback and submission status
- •This shows your child that you're engaged and supportive of their learning




