Assessment and Feedback

Each subject is taught by specialist teachers who bring learning to life through engaging lessons and practical experiences. Students are assessed regularly through a combination of classwork, projects, and formal assessments. Feedback is shared with students and parents to support progress and celebrate achievement.

Homework

Homework is set regularly to reinforce classroom learning and encourage independent study habits. Tasks are carefully designed to help students consolidate knowledge, practise key skills, and begin to develop deeper understanding by connecting new learning to prior knowledge - supporting the development of strong cognitive schemas.

Literacy & Reading

At Parkside, we take literacy seriously.

We know it is the foundation of academic success and empowerment across the whole of a student's life. The ability to read, write, speak, and listen with confidence opens doors to every subject, every career, and every aspect of a student's future.

We are committed to creating a culture where literacy is valued and celebrated.

Our vision is for every learner to be able to access complex ideas, express themselves effectively, and participate fully in an increasingly complex and challenging world.

We know that students have complex literacy needs, and our diagnostic intervention programme enables us to intervene early, where needed, to support all students to progress. Alongside this, our universal offer celebrates and encourages literacy and storytelling for all.



Positive Culture

A positive culture is the foundation of every child's success; we celebrate effort, progress, and achievement through a whole-school rewards system.

This recognises students not just for academic excellence, but also for kindness, resilience, leadership, and contribution to our community. You will see many of our students proudly wearing their rewards badges, which range from Bronze to Diamond. These badges are awarded termly and reflect the progress and achievements students make across the school.

Students also earn reward points every day for positive behaviour and success, which they can save and spend in our dedicated Reward Shop. The prizes in the shop are chosen through student voice, ensuring that the rewards are meaningful and motivating. Current items include Uno cards, footballs, hair bows, highlighters, and much more. This gives pupils an immediate and tangible sense of achievement, encouraging them to set goals and take pride in their progress.

Alongside day-to-day praise in lessons, we hold termly rewards events, providing every student the chance to shine. Our approach fosters pride, belonging, and motivation - ensuring that every child feels valued and inspired to be their best.
