Student Toilet Strategy - Parent/Carer Information

We are currently reviewing our student toilet access policy to ensure that learning is protected, students' needs are met, and staff are supported in applying a consistent approach.

While we understand that sometimes there are genuine needs for students to leave lessons to use the toilet, we also want to make sure that learning time is maximised and that all students are safe and supervised. Frequent lesson-time toilet visits can have a significant impact on learning, wellbeing, and the classroom environment. Here are some of the key reasons behind this review:

Your Learning

- Missing learning during lessons is as disruptive as being absent from school
- Lost learning over time can lead to a drop in academic performance, which affects future success and life chances

Mental Health

Missing parts of lessons can increase anxiety, as students often feel more stressed when they
return and realise they've fallen behind

Impact on Others

 Leaving lessons interrupts the flow of teaching and learning, which can affect the progress of other students and cause frustration for staff

Ultimately, unnecessary toilet breaks make life harder for everyone — and we don't want that for our students because we care about their success and wellbeing.

During the week commencing Monday 17 November, we will be holding student assemblies to explain the reasons for this review and to gather their views. We'll also be running student voice activities to ensure their feedback shapes our final strategy.
